EVENT WRAP-UP – STADIUM MASTERS HOSTED ABC CC – SUN 23RD OCTOBER

Extracts from a report by Peter Lyster, Meet Director

Once again we held a super successful event. We had 121 entrants and of these, 113 actually swam. We had one swimmer from Melbourne and twenty one clubs participated.

We had a great team of volunteers and rightly deserved the title of The Magnificent Marshalling Team. Most were available on the day and were allocated to their regular jobs. On Saturday afternoon prior to the meet, Pamela, Phyll, Barry and I went to the pool to check on the setup. On the day, as well as our magnificent helpers, we had a Stadium employee operating the Quantum computer in the timing room and the MM side was operated by Anne Edmondson and Richard Johnson. It worked really well and we had no timing problems. Our volunteers did a great job keeping the Meet running very smoothly and it finished on time at 11.50am. Everyone then went over to the UWA Hockey Club rooms for refreshments, raffle and the results.

Marg Smithson and her team had prepared a great spread which was really appreciated. Bill had bought in sandwiches and wraps from Costco and the members had provided lots of fruit and cakes.

The raffle was very successful with very well-presented baskets of goodies. The Stadium also presented some tickets for the raffle. It raised \$476.

Helen Bird set new State records in the 200m IM and the 50m Free and Pauline Wingate equalled her own record in the 200m Breast. Mandurah broke the State and the National records In the Woman's 320 relay in a time of 3:16.42, a fantastic performance.

The Club Challenge was won by Superfins, Stadium Masters came second and Mandurah Masters were third, just one point behind us. The Handicap award was won by Perth City.
