Lynda Joachim Award – Champion Lady Swimmer

The Lynda Joachim Award is awarded to the champion female swimmer who achieves the most points during the year calculated on the champion female swimmer who achieves the most points during the year from their best 4 results from ABC CC meets. This is according to the formula detailed in the Club by laws. This award is named after Lynda Joachim, Snappers' first president and then captain for two years. Lynda returned home to Queensland in 1995. She was appointed the first life member in 2004.

The Cliffe Webb Award is awarded to the champion swimmer who achieves the most points during the year calculated on the swimmer who achieves the most points from the State Championships and our hosted ABC CC meet. This is according to the formula detailed in the Club by laws. Winners of the Kevin Wren and Lynda Joachim awards in the same year are not eligible for this award. Inaugurated in 2002, the trophy was donated by Cliffe Webb, who joined the Club on a visit from the UK, and who continues to enjoy his association with the club.



Founder's Award

The Founders' Award is presented to the swimmer who has never won any of the above awards or the Founders' Award and whose swimming performance shows the most commitment and greatest improvement over the year.

One point is given for each PAB (personal age best) and 3 points for each PB (personal best). Points are calculated according to the formula detailed in the Club by laws. This award was also inaugurated in 2002. It was donated by Glad McGough, the coach who conducted the original Swim to a Healthy Lifestyle program, in honour of the participants who went on to form the Snappers Club.



Beatie Norris Endurance Award -

Winner – Audrey Bullough

Runner up – Pamela Walter

The Beatie Norris Endurance Award is presented to the swimmer who achieves the highest number of points in the Endurance1000 program boosted by age-based bonus points calculated by the club. Beatie Norris learned to swim and joined the club at 70 and she concentrated on swimming aerobic swims.

The Award that is named after her is therefore based on the e1000 program. Pamela Walter and her sisters donated the trophy for the Beatie Norris Endurance Award in honour of their mother who was a Club member for 18 years. Beatie died in 2014.





President's Award

Winner – Bill Woodhouse

The President's Award is selected by the President and awarded to a Club member who has made an outstanding contribution to the administration and/or development of the Club.

"Bill has fulfilled a variety of roles within the Club over many years while working quietly behind the scenes. He is the Coach of our Friday sessions and is responsible for submitting members' timed swim results to the portal and for publication in Snappets. He also tracks our combined swim distance progress towards Queensland via the coast. As well as being a committee member, Bill frequently takes on the responsibility of organising the venues for our post-ABCCC event functions and our committee



meetings. As the orchestrator of the weekly raffle, Bill also encourages members to gamble heavily after each Wednesday and Friday training sessions". – congratulations Bill.

Participation Award

Winner – Helen Austin

The Participation Award is presented annually to the member who actively participates in the most training sessions, club swims and ABC Club Challenges, either as a swimmer, official or helper. This award also recognizes the extra and special efforts contributed by the recipient in their own time to advance the club's ideals.

"Despite being a new member, Helen simply dived in at the deep end and just kept swimming. She quickly became a very regular attendee at our training sessions and at inter-club competitions. Helen has assumed a role in supporting Anne with Meet Manager and Pamela with Team Manager assists in the checking of results from events, and helps to check and submit times from club swims and internal times for submission to the top ten" congratulations Helen.



Star Awards – 6 swimmers awarded for this year 2023

Endurance Star Awards were inaugurated in 2000 to encourage more Club members to participate in and benefit from endurance swims, even though they may not be proficient in all strokes. From 2007, Four and Five Star Awards are available for swimmers who also complete the endurance Individual Medley and Butterfly swims. Speed is not a factor and there is no element of competition.

The Star Awards are presented to the swimmers who have completed all the aerobic swims in a stroke ie $5 \times 400m$, $5 \times 800m$, $1 \times 1500m$, $1 \times \frac{1}{2} hr$, $1 \times \frac{3}{4} hr$ and $1 \times 1 hr$ swims.

1 Star Award

A One Star Endurance Award is given to anyone who completes the 14 swims in the Vorgee Endurance 1000 program (five x 400 m, five x 800 m, and one each of 1500m, half hour, three quarter hour and one hour) in any one of the three major strokes, freestyle, backstroke or breaststroke

From the coaches - 2024 New Year Resolutions for Stadium Masters Swimmers

l will:

- 1. Arrive 10 minutes before the session to be ready for the coach's briefing
- 2. Pay attention to the briefing and ask questions if unsure of instructions
- 3. Observe lane etiquette:
- Swim to the left of the lane rope
- On completing the length, move to the lane rope on the push-off side to allow incoming swimmers to finish in the centre
- If passing, wait until there are no on-coming swimmers, move out and swim around; this may need a little acceleration
- 4. Maintain 10 second push-off time from swimmer ahead
- 5. Take a turn at leading my lane
- 6. Avoid drafting
- 7. Perform all starts and turns as if swimming in a refereed event
- 8. Focus on technique, especially streamlining and correct, quick turns.
