



EVENT WRAP UP – SWIM FOR MEMORY – SUN 23rd June 2024



This year's Swim for Memory was (as for last year) in aid of the Australian Alzheimer's Research Foundation (AARF). Thirteen teams registered for the event (5 associated with Belmont Masters and the remaining teams were made up of swimmers from Stadium Masters, Claremont Masters and their family and friends. There were a lot of Belles! Four all-female teams but only one all-male team.

The event (a one-hour relay swim for teams of 4) was held outdoors at HBF Stadium in the 8-lane pool converted to a 25 m pool. Prior to the event all WA Masters Swimming Clubs had been invited to take part.

There were three types of awards presented;

- 1. Longest distance swum in the appropriate age group
- 2. Distance swum closest to the nominated distance
- 3. Most money raised for the charity

Other Stadium Masters Swimming Club members came to support the event; Jo Alievski and Denise Scott. I hope I haven't missed someone. On the day, Belmont support was significant, as was support for the City Beach Crawlers.

Now for a status report on the money raised (as money is still coming in after the event). At last count there were 45 donors online with a total of \$3,721 donated. I have recorded cash donations totalling \$3,245. This gives a grand total of \$6,966 which exceeds last year's effort (about \$6,359) with 1 extra team registered this year. Given the current economic climate I think this is a magnificent result. I will keep you informed of any further progress as it is still possible to donate online (preferably), or in cash to me. Well done to everyone concerned. Let's hope this donation is instrumental in finding "a cure" for Alzheimers! Do "remember" to participate next year.




CLUB CAPTAIN'S CORNER
